PBS Hawai'i is committed to enhancing our Passport communication with regular "Passport Picks" and "Binge Worthy" opportunities. We will also provide more tech support information in our Program Guide, monthly newsletter and on our website, including links to tutorial videos for assistance.

Mayor Harry Kim, the late Hawai'i Supreme Court Chief Justice Ronald Moon and current Lt. Gov. Sylvia Luke.

As the title suggests, the film is a love song arranged and played as a heartfelt tribute to those early pioneers who left home in search of opportunity and a better life for themselves and their families.



Songs of Love from Hawai'i is a captivating reverie of music and history celebrating Korean immigrants who first made their way to territorial Hawai'i at the beginning of the 20th century.

Filmmaker Jinyoung Lee weaves together three distinct episodes that combine firsthand accounts of those early immigrants with virtuosic musical performances from renowned string players Richard Yongjae O'Neill, Chee-Yun, Ignace "Iggy" Jang and Hawai'i entertainer/composer Keola Beamer.

The film features beautiful animated sequences, previously unseen archival images and footage, and striking landscapes that help illustrate the multi-faceted experiences of the early Korean immigrants who came to Hawai'i as plantation workers and picture brides.

Songs of Love from Hawai'i shares the stories of sacrifice, hope and resilience of these Korean men and women who left behind a legacy for their descendants, including former Hawai'i County

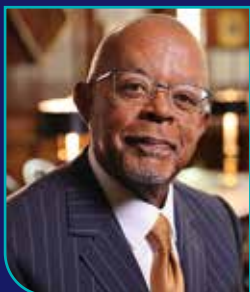

Home is Here

In 2000, Hawai'i's Ann Yoshida was 21 years old and attending college in Utah with her whole life in front of her. Then a car crash left her paralyzed.

"I had no experience before or with someone who was paralyzed or anything like that," she says. "I actually didn't know the impact that that would have on my life."

She describes it as almost like a rebirth and not just physically.

Her inspiring story of recovery and re-direction is part of **Home is Here** this month.

"I had a rediscovery of who I really was, who I wanted to become. I'm the maker of my own life, like I can mold myself into whatever I want it to be," she says. "I went out with a curious heart and a curious mind, and a curious body to discover what I could do. And realized that it's pretty amazing what I could do, and I still can do."

It's that can-do attitude that has helped propel Yoshida all the way to the Paralympic Games. Learn about her journey to get there and



how she's helping others realize their potential.

In our other story this month, we head to Pana'ewa on the island of Hawai'i to learn about the University of Hawai'i at Hilo's beekeeping certificate program. It's the only program of its kind in the state and it can be a little intimidating.

"When I first went into the hives, I would say like that nervousness, that fear kind of was there," says Adam Vasquez, a student in the program.

Bees often get a bad rap for their ability to sting and swarm,

but the program aims to change that perception by teaching students to take a closer look at the insects.

"They can hear, they can smell, they can feel and this is how they orderly manage a hive," says UH Hilo entomology professor Lorna Tsutsumi.

We'll learn more about the inner workings of bees and their hives, plus we will talk to local celebrity chef Alan Wong about the Adopt-A-Behive program and how its helping both local chefs and students.
